Mayor Turner informed council that the city can obtain additional land at Frederick's Landing, however, he would need council's approval to put out the expense to have the land re-surveyed which will cost \$5,000.00 to \$7,000.00 and then it must be approved by Frankfort and Washington.

Councilman Blankenship asked if we would be guaranteed to receive the property. Mayor Turner stated that there were no guarantees but we're very confident that we would.

Councilman Dinn questioned if we could be reimbursed for the cost of the re-surveying. Mr. Vance stated that we would not.

Councilman Herald asked if the land would be suitable for shelters. Mr. Vance advised it could be used for shelters, picnic areas or walking trails.

Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship, seconded by, Councilman Dinn to approve the expense to re-survey the property located at Frederick's Landing up to \$7,000.00 to be surveyed by Jim Viox and authorized the Mayor to sign documents. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Turner informed council that there is a Grant from the Licking River Green Way for up to \$150,000 which could be used at Fredericks' Landing for a land water conservation trail along the Licking River. The cost to the city would be \$75,000.00.

Mr. Vance explained the grant requirements and how the funds could be used. He also elaborated on and passed out a brochure for council to review of a trail along the Licking River that other cities are currently putting into place.

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Councilman Herald suggested that this item be tabled until the next meeting until further information could be received.
