#### September 4, 2012

The regular meeting of the Wilder City Council was held on Monday, September 4, 2012 at the Wilder City Building, 520 Licking Pike, Wilder, Kentucky 41071.

#### Call to Order:

Mayor Turner called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

#### **Roll Call:**

Roll call was answered by Councilman Robert Blankenship, Councilman Michael Dinn, Councilwoman Monica Gearding, Councilman Brack Herald and Councilman David Martin.

**State Representative Dennis Keene:** Presented a check to Mayor Turner from the State of Kentucky for \$43,000.00 for street repairs.

Representative Keene offered his condolences to the Williams Family.

#### **Approval of Minutes:**

Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Herald to approve the Minutes of August 20, 2012, Regular Meeting. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

#### Attorney's Report:

Attorney Verst presented Ordinance No. 12-0801: Amending Chapter 72 Section 72.02 of the Wilder Municipal Code setting speed limits and establishing parking restrictions and Stop sign locations for certain city maintained streets located in the City of Wilder. [Second Reading]

Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Dinn to approve Ordinance No. 12-0801: Amending Chapter 72 Section 72.02 of the Wilder Municipal Code

setting speed limits and establishing parking restrictions and Stop sign locations for certain city maintained streets located in the City of Wilder. Mayor Turner called for a vote.

Attorney Verst presented Ordinance No. 12-0802: Levying an Ad Valorem Tax Rate for the year of 2012 and setting the Waste Collection/Recycling Rate for 20123 on all property in the City of Wilder, Ky, Levying an Ad Valorem Tax Rate on Motor Vehicles for 2012 in the City of Wilder, Ky, establishing the rates therefore and adopting the Campbell County Tax Commissioner's Assessment on said property and providing for a Tax Lien against all Taxable Property in the City of Wilder, Kentucky to secure the payment of said taxes.

The rate of taxation for year 2012 shall be .200 percent of each \$100 of assessed valuation for real estate, and .148 percent of each \$100 assessed valuation of motor vehicles, and .337 percent of assessed valuation for other personal property. All of said amount shall be and is hereby taxed for the general fund of the City.

The waste/recycling collection rate, which shall be applied to the 2012 property tax bill for 2013 waste collection services, shall be set at \$150.00 per unit annually and \$135.00 annually for those properties receiving homestead exemption. [Second Reading]

Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Martin to approve Ordinance No. 12-0802: Levying an Ad Valorem Tax Rate for the year of 2012 and setting the Waste Collection/Recycling Rate for 20123 on all property in the City of Wilder, Ky, Levying an Ad Valorem Tax Rate on Motor Vehicles for 2012 in the City of Wilder, Ky, establishing the rates therefore and adopting the Campbell County Tax Commissioner's Assessment on said property and providing for a Tax Lien against all Taxable Property in the City of Wilder, Kentucky to secure the payment of said taxes.

#### **City Administrator's Comments:**

Mr. Vance informed council that the two highest bids for the 2004 Crown Victoria Cruiser were \$3200.00 and \$2601.00.

Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Dinn to accept the bids of \$3200.00 and \$2601.00 for the 2004 Crown Victoria Cruiser. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Vance stated that all of the candidates for City Council need to submit their bio's for the newsletter by September 18, 2012.

He also offered condolences to the Williams Family.

Mr. Vance thanked Chief Profitt for his help with a 2 year scholarship for his son.

Mr. Vance informed council that there are still funds available to do additional streets repairs. At this time M & W can extend their contract prices and complete Overlook Circle for \$119,050.00.

Discussion ensued regarding street conditions and repairs.

Upon motion of Councilman Dinn seconded by Councilman Blankenship to approve the extension of the contract to M & W, using the same unit pricing as Hillside to complete Overlook Circle for \$119,050.00. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.
