CITY COUNCIL MEETING

September 16, 2013

The regular meeting of the Wilder City Council was held on Monday, September 16, 2013 at the Wilder City Building, 520 Licking Pike, Wilder, Kentucky 41071.

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

Call to Order:

Mayor Turner called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Roll Call:

Roll call was answered by Councilman Robert Blankenship, Councilman Brack Herald, Councilwoman Monica Gearding Councilman Robert Arnold, Councilman Robert Honaker and Councilman Bradley Jones.

Approval of Minutes:

Upon motion of Councilman Herald seconded by Councilman Jones to approve the Minutes of September 3, 2013 Regular Meeting. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Incoming and outgoing correspondence copied to Council prior to the meeting.

Reports Presented:

Financial Reports

General Fund ending 8/31/2013

Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Honaker to Approve financial reports and authorize payment of bills for General Fund Ending 08/31/13. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

SPECIAL GUEST

Mayor Turner Introduced Kristine Frech with The Licking River Greenway & Trails.

Ms. Frech gave council an update on the current and future trails and the goal for the first portion of the trail in Wilder which is to connect the city building to Frederick's Landing.

Ms. Frech stated that Vision 2015 is prepared to grant the city \$40,000.00 toward the implementation of a trail in Wilder with the following conditions:

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- Minimum 1 to 1 match from the city.
- The \$40,000.00 received from Vision 15 must be spent by the end of the year.

Discussion ensued regarding:

- grant requirements
- total cost estimate
- Policing
- Possible Flooding of the path
- City funds budgeted

Council expressed that they would like more concrete numbers on the cost before committing.

Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Upon motion of Councilman Jones seconded by Councilman Blankenship to enter into Executive Session per KRS 61.810 sub-section 1B at the conclusion of the meeting to discuss a transferring interest in real estate. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

City Administrator's Comments:

- Langview Easements have been received, all but two.
- Alanna, Feldman and Regiment work is almost complete.

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- S.W.E.M.S. meeting will be on Tuesday, September 17, 2013 @ 5:30 p.m.
- Doug Bray, owner of 9 Beacon Drive, informed him that the lack of fiber optics and lack of water supply was keeping him from renting/selling the property.

Mr. Vance advised that Mr. Bray would like the city to proceed with the process of putting a bid out to enlarge the water line and see if the city would be able to help with the cost.

Discussion ensued regarding the possible costs of the water line upgrade.

Upon motion of Councilman Blankenship seconded by Councilman Arnold to authorize Mr. Vance to get the construction drawings and secure bids to upgrade the water line located at 9 Beacon Drive. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Fire Chief Comments:

- Wiffle Ball Tournament was held they raised \$600.00 for their charity.
- New squad is in but not in service yet.

Police Chief Comments:

- Announced that Cecil Brown will be retiring at the end of the month and they will present him with a plaque at the next council meeting.
- Advised that there have been a lot of daytime robberies throughout the county.

- Questioned the dirt being put in next to Frederick's Landing. Mr. Vance advised that the fill dirt is being accepted to fill in a hole.
