

The regular meeting of the Wilder City Council was held on Monday, September 15, 2014 at the Wilder City Building, 520 Licking Pike, Wilder, Kentucky 41071.

Call to Order:

Mayor Turner called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Roll Call:

Roll call was answered by Councilman Robert Blankenship, Councilman Herald, Councilwoman Monica Gearding and Councilman Bradley Jones.

Approval of Minutes:

Upon motion of Councilman Jones seconded by Councilman Blankenship to approve the Minutes of September 2, 2014 regular Meeting. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Financial Reports

General Fund ending 8/31/2014

Upon motion of Councilman Herald seconded by Councilman Blankenship to Approve financial reports and authorize payment of bills for General Fund Ending 8/31/14. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney's Report:

Attorney Verst presented Ordinance No. 14-0901: Levying and Ad Valorem Tax Rate for the Year of 2014 on All Property Real and Personal in the City of Wilder, Ky, Setting the Waste Collection/Recycling Rate for 2015 on Properties Receiving Curb Side Collection, Levying An Ad Valorem Tax Rate on Motor Vehicles for 2014 in the City of Wilder, Ky, Establishing the Rates Therefore and Adopting the Campbell County Tax Commissioner's Assessment on said Property and providing for a Tax Lien Against All Taxable Property in the City of Wilder, Kentucky to Secure the Payment of Said Taxes. The Rate of Taxation for the City of Wilder, Kentucky for year 2014 shall be .200 percent of each \$100 of Assessed Valuation for Real Estate, and .148 percent of each \$100 Assessed Valuation of

Motor Vehicles and .337 percent of Assessed Valuation for other Personal Property. All of said amount shall be and is hereby taxed for the General Fund of the City. The Waste/Recycling Rate, which shall be applied to the 2014 Property Tax Bill for 2015 Waste Collection Services shall be set at \$150.00 per unit annually and \$135.00 annually for those properties receiving homestead exemption. [Second Reading]

Upon motion of Councilman Herald seconded by Councilman Blankenship to reject the bids for Storm Sewer, 24" Concrete Curb & Milling and Resurfacing on Gloria Terrell & Plum Streets due to an excess of \$100,000.00 over estimated costs. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.
