Mayor Turner called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Roll Call:

Roll call was answered by Councilman Tim Gilkison, Councilman Bob Arnold, Councilman Rob Honaker, Councilman Bob Blankenship, Councilwoman Valerie Jones and Councilman Jerry Sebastian.

Attorney's Report:

Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Attorney Verst announced the Wilder Public Property and Project Corporation was up for renewal. He needed a motion to appoint Terry Vance to the registered agent, Stanley Turner as President, Robert Blankenship as Secretary, and Robert Honaker as Vice President of the Wilder Public Property and Project Corporation. The renewal is \$15.00 a year.

Citizen Comments:

Mayor's Comments:

- Fish Frys went very well. Chief Neyman did a great job.
- Easter Egg Hunt was a big success.
- Next meeting council should have a rough draft of the 2018/2019 budget.

City Administrator's Comments:

- Docks are in and will be installed as soon as the river recedes. The final cost of the docks was \$8,222.
- Work is progressing on the Country Drive Storm Sewer. The engineer was going to ask the contractor for a change order to extend paving down Town Drive.
- There was one bid for the Charger of \$1,550 from John Sparks.

Upon motion of Councilman Arnold and seconded by Councilman Blankenship to accept the bid of \$1,550 for the Charger. Mayor Turner called for a vote. Motion carried unanimously.

- Animal Control will invoice the City approximately \$271 per month. The formal agreement will be coming soon.

Council Comments:

Councilman Sebastian:

- Thanked Chief Neyman for the tour of the Fire Department.

Councilman Honaker:

- Questioned what the state's plan was for the mudslide on Licking Pike.
 - City Administrator Vance said he will reach out to the state again to see what their long term plan is.

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Councilman Blankenship:

- The house as you go from Wilder to Newport on the right side of the road past Aspen Pines needs to be cleaned up.
 - City Administrator Vance will call Doug Roell from Newport to ask for his help.

Councilman Gilkison:

- With the Police Department going from the 40 caliber to the 9 millimeter; does anything need to be addressed with this change?
 - Chief Williams announced that City Administrator Vance will have the Ordinance at the next meeting. There is nothing else that needs to be addressed.

Councilwoman Jones:

- Thanked Chief Neyman and his team for all of their hard work on the Fish Frys.
- Thanked everyone involved for a great Easter Egg Hunt.
- The bidder conference for the fire house will be April 3. The three companies that are being considered are CR, MSP, and Hub Weber. The committee, Councilman Honaker, Councilman Arnold, and Councilwoman Jones, along with Chief Neyman and Assistant Chief Norris will be in attendance. After the bidder conference and after all questions have been answered, the committee would like to make a selection and present that to council on April 16, 2018.

Councilman Arnold:

- Thanked the Fire and Police Departments for the Fish Frys and Easter Egg Hunt.
- The Park Study Committee, Councilman Arnold, Councilwoman Jones, and Councilman Blankenship, will be reaching out to some citizens and businesses to serve on the steering committee for the Frederick's Landing park study.

City Clerk:

Police Chief Comments:

- Thanked Officer Hill and Officer Collins for guiding the Easter Bunny around at the Easter Egg Hunt on Sunday. Pictures will be available in the next week if anyone wants a copy at no cost.

Fire Chief Comments:

- Thanked everyone for attending the Fish Frys.
- Last week there was a Chlorine leak at Town & Country. Three people were transported.

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
Adjournment:
