Smart 911 Service

We want to endorse and encourage all residents of Wilder to sign up for a free service, Smart 911. Many of us are now using cell phones for everyday use and have gotten rid of land line telephones, although they can be registered as well. With Smart 911, you can register special needs, medication information, specific directions to a location and several other types of information you may feel important to first responders during an emergency. Additionally, Smart 911 uses your cell phone's GPS information to pin point your location instead of a triangulation of towers that only gives an approximate position for responders to try and locate.

The information you provide is secure and private. It is only disseminated to the necessary dispatchers and first responders in the event of the specific emergency. Once that emergency is concluded, the information is not accessible to anyone.

Once you go to Smart911.com, you will see there are even more benefits to the free service such as weather or even other emergency notifications. Again, please register today for free and help us, as first responders, provide the quickest and safest service to you and your families.

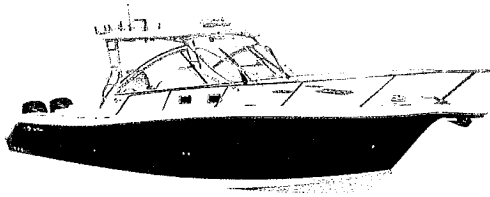
From the desk of City Administrator

CAMPERS AND BOATS STORED IN DRIVEWAYS

We have been receiving a lot of complaints regarding homeowners storing recreational vehicles in their driveways. The City of Wilder Zoning Ordinance regulates the storing of boat, campers and other type of recreational vehicles in driveways. In fact, most of the newer subdivisions have deed restrictions the specifically prohibit any storing of this type of equipment. Deed restrictions are not enforced by the city but may be enforced by homeowners within the development that the restrictions are imposed. If you have questions regarding deed restrictions or city regulations please contact the City Administrator. Below is a copy of the section of the city zoning ordinance that pertains to this particular rule.

SECTION 9.23 REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO PARKING OR STORING OF TRAILERS, MANUFACTURED HOMES, CAMPERS, INOPERABLE VEHICLES, AND OTHER SUCH TYPE EQUIPMENT

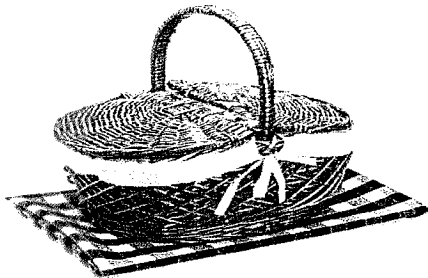
C. Except as provided for herein, it shall be unlawful to park and/or store any trailer, manufactured home, recreational vehicle, camper, boat, or other such type equipment, within any place or location in the city. The outside storage and/or parking of any trailer, manufactured home, recreational vehicle, camper, boat, or similar type equipment, shall be restricted to the side or rear yard of all lots within the jurisdiction of the legislative body, except as herein provided, and in cases where, due to unique conditions, topographic or other, which do not allow use of the rear yard, the board of adjustment may permit such storage to be located in the side yard of the lot following review and approval by said board. The board may impose certain requirements (such as provided in Section 9.17 of this ordinance) to insure that said vehicle and related equipment is properly screened from view of adjacent property. In no case shall more than one of the aforementioned vehicles or similar type equipment be permitted outside of a completely enclosed building on any lot or parcel of land. Storage and/or parking of any trailer, manufactured home, recreational vehicle, camper, boat, or similar type equipment may be permitted within driveways during the period from May 1 through the following October 15, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the required off-street parking spaces are available in addition to the space utilized by the aforementioned vehicles or similar type equipment; (2) the stored and/or parked vehicle or equipment shall not extend over any property or right-of way line; and (3) no more than one such vehicle or piece of similar type equipment is permitted in the driveway at any one time.

POT HOLES ROAD MAINTENANCE

Do you ever wonder who is responsible for street/road maintenance and pot hole repair. Depending on what road it is determines what agency (city or state) will make the repairs. In the City of Wilder many of the heavily travelled roads are maintained by the Kentucky State Transportation Cabinet. Below is a list of roads that fall under state maintenance.

- Johns Hill Road State Route 2345
- Three Mile Road State Route 2238
- Mooock Road State Route 1632
- Licking Pike State Route 9
- AA Highway State Route 9
- I-275 Including on and off ramps

BARKING DOGS

Just a reminder the City of Wilder has ordinances pertaining to animals specifically with regard to the following issues:

A Leash Law, meaning dogs are not permitted to run at large. They must be on a leash if they are off of the property where they are normally kept.

Habitual barking. No person shall harbor, keep, or permit a dog owned by him or which is under his control, which by loud and frequent or habitual barking, howling or helping, caused annoyance or disturbance to other person or persons living or having a right to be in the vicinity.

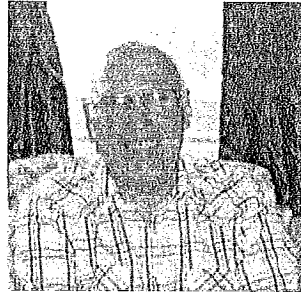
Removal of excrement. Please be responsible and clean up after your pet. The city has installed more waste stations along sidewalks and parks in the city.

In Memory Of

The City of Wilder lost one of its original residents last month with the passing of Bob Porter. Robert William Porter was 90 years young when he passed away peacefully on February 9, 2019. He was married to Mary Margaret Torline on June 12, 1947 and she preceded him in death in 2005.



Mr. Porter served our country as a WWII veteran having served in the 82nd Airborne as a parachutist, as well as a bandsman. He was a graduate of the University of Cincinnati, a HAM radio operator and a Kentucky Colonel. He was a member of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky # 109 and the Scottish Rite of Free Masonry.

Bob also served the City of Wilder as a volunteer firefighter, member of the Planning and Zoning Board as well as Mayor. He built his own home in Wilder, where his family enjoyed many years together.

Bob is survived by his loving children Kathleen Bail, Michael Porter, Gale Miller and Kimberly Purnell, as well as 11 grandchildren, 17 great grandchildren and 1 great great grandchild.

It was with great honor that the Wilder Police led his funeral procession. We extend our appreciation, condolences, and deepest sympathies to Mr. Porter's family.
