



From the desk of Police Chief:

School is in session!

It's back to school time. The beach bag has been swapped for the book bag. For some, the thought of the first day of school generates feelings of excitement. For others, it may be feelings of anxiety or uncertainty. Social media posts will show some parents rejoicing, as their teens head back, and others will show tears, as the little ones march off, for their first day away from home. School being back in session affects people differently. Traffic, as a result of school being back in session, affects us all. Here are some driving tips, to keep families safe this school year:

- 1. Slow down and pay attention. Watch for the school zone lights that may reduce the speed limit on your daily commute, which have not been activated for several months.
- 2. Pay attention to the painted lines for cross walks. Make sure you don't block crosswalks with your vehicle, when stopping in traffic, or preparing to make a turn.
- 3. If you're dropping kids off for school, don't make them cross the road. Turn around, if needed, to make sure they can exit the vehicle, on the same side of the road, as the school.
- 4. Never go around a stopped vehicle that stopped for pedestrians, or to unload children.
- 5. Be vigilant and look for kids on bikes, scooters, or skateboards, since they can be unpredictable.
- 6. **Know the laws in regard to stopped school buses.** 2 lane roads, both directions have to stop. 2 lane road with a center turning lane, both directions have to stop. 4 lane roads, only the traffic following the bus must stop.

Summer has wrapped up and now were are gearing up for Tax season. 2019 Taxes will be going out the beginning of October. Also as a reminder, bills are mailed to the home owner. If you have an escrow account you can forward your bill to the escrow company once you receive it. It is the homeowners responsibility to make sure their property tax is paid. 2019 Property tax is due by November 30, 2019, anything after that is considered late and will accrue penalty and interest accordingly. From the desk of City Administer:

ANIMAL CONTROL

We all love our pets and the city cares too. The city has ordinances in place to make sure pet owners are also responsible pet owners.

<u>City Code 91.01</u> Prohibition against Dogs Running at Large: This ordinance contains a host of provisions that include maintaining control of dogs while in the public and keeping dogs safely on private property. It deals with vicious dogs and provide for penalties for dogs that bite or attack people or other animals.

<u>City Code 91.04</u> Removal of Excrement: This section of the city code refers to cleaning up after your pet. The city has provided a number of waste stations along various walkways and parks used by dog walkers. Please be responsible and clean up after your pets. City code provides for a penalty for violation of this section of city ordinances.

City Code 91.05 Habitual Barking Prohibited: This section deals with a barking, howling or yelping dogs. We have all had to deal with this nuisance from time to time. If this becomes an issue of annoyance or disturbance to other persons, the city can respond. If possible, we would prefer you speak with your neighbor and let them know that their dog is a problem. If this is not possible or if the problem persists, please contact the Wilder Police Department or Campbell County Dispatch and a report will be made. The dog owner will most likely be warned or cited for violation of the city ordinance.

<u>City Code 91.06</u> Adequate Food, Water, Shelter and Care to be Provided. It is unlawful for any person to exhibit, display or keep any animal without providing food, water, shelter, and adequate space, ventilation, shading from the sun, proper sanitation, care and medical attention.

The city is now contracting with the Northern Kentucky Animal Control to respond to, investigate and regulate animal issues within the city. The animal control serves Wilder and 9 other cities. The Wilder Police can also be called and will respond to animal related issues as well.

Road Repair Update

For those who travel Johns Hill Road, you have noticed that there has been some on-going work. Periodically that road was closed in August so that the hillside could be reinforced to address the slide area. We have been notified by KYTC District 6 that the guardrail will be replaced and the road will be repaved in early September, weather permitting. Please know that the City Administrator has stayed in regular contact with the Transportation Cabinet in order to keep this a focus of their attention.

At 2:00pm we are having our 54th annual flag raising ceremony. It is my great privilege to lead the City of Wilder in the annual flag-raising ceremony to honor all veterans, past and present, for their service, dedication, and commitment in safeguarding the liberties and freedoms of our country. This year, our City Attorney, Justin Verst, and his 8 brothers, all military veterans, will be honored for their service. I invite all veterans and residents of Wilder to join us in honoring all who have served our country.

Later in the month of September, we will have an official ground-breaking for the renovation of our park behind the City Building. Once completed next summer, it will feature upgraded shelters with restrooms, a splash park, volleyball courts, and an event lawn.
