

POT HOLES /ROAD MAINTENANCE

Do you ever wonder who is responsible for street/road maintenance and pot hole repair? Depending on what road it is determines what agency (city or state) will make the repairs. In the City of Wilder many of the heavily travelled roads are maintained by the Kentucky State Transportation Cabinet. Below is a list of roads that fall under state maintenance.

- Johns Hill Road State Route 2345
- Three Mile Road State Route 2238
- Moock Road State Route 1632
- Licking Pike State Route 9
- AA Highway State Route 9
- I-275 Including on and off ramps

DOG ORDINANCES

JUST A REMINDER THAT THE CITY OF WILDER HAS ORDINANCES PERTAINING TO ANIMALS, SPECIFICALLY WITH REGARD TO THE FOLLOWINGS ISSUES:

- Leash Law: Dogs are not permitted to run loose. They must be on a leash if off of owner's property.
- No person shall harbor, keep, or permit a dog owned by him or which is under his control, which by loud and frequent or habitual barking, howling or yelping, causes annoyance or disturbance to other person or persons living or having the right to be in the vicinity so as to hear said barking, howling or yelping.
- Removal of Excrement: Those responsible for pets must take care of cleanup after their pet. The city has installed waste stations along sidewalks and in city parks.

SAFETY TIPS

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Weep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Neep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

PROPANE Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

FACTS

- July is the peak month for grill fires.
- Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

FROM THE DESK OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

CITY STREET REPAIRS

Residents may notice some city streets getting spot repair work during the next few months. Maintenance crews and contractors working on behalf of the city will be performing repairs on the following streets.

PLANNED 2025 STREET REPAIR LIST PROJECTS

- Portions Vine Street
- Portions of Hillside Drive near Beverly Drive spot panel replacement
- Interstate Access Road
- Portions of the city building parking lot
- End of Banklick Road Phase II to end of street
- Periodic repairs on Bentwood Hills Drive as needed.

In addition to these area repairs, our own public works crews will be performing crack sealing on certain city streets in late summer or early fall of 2025. We are beginning to catch up on some of the streets. Crack sealing will add years to the life of a street by keeping water out of the cracks and joints. This work may lead to temporary lane closures and minor inconvenience in some neighborhoods. Additional repairs may also be added to the above list. Residents are being asked to be patient during this repair work. It will be accomplished as quickly as possible with the least amount of inconvenience to the traveling public. If anyone should have any questions concerning the repair work, or have a street you are concerned about, they are encouraged to contact the City Administrator.

STREET AND ROADWORK IN GENERAL

Street repairs, lane marking and other road related work is common this time of year. Caution should always be used when driving in areas marked for construction, wet paint etc. The safety of our workers and the traveling public is our main concern while completing the job in a timely fashion.

Whenever streets are worked on barricades, signs and other measures are used to alert the public. Barricades and barrels are used for specific reasons and they should remain in place until moved by the contractor or city personnel. This is done not only to protect the workers but the finished product and work being done. At no time should motorists or homeowners move or ignore traffic control devices.

No one likes sitting in traffic or being detoured from their normal routine. We simply ask that everyone remain patient, pay attention to traffic control devices. The city and the contractor will make every effort to minimize inconvenience to the traveling public.

As we close out our 4th Quarter, there is a lot to share with you regarding the progress we've made and the exciting initiatives on the horizon. The city's economic development efforts are proving to be quite active, promising growth and opportunities for our community. And, I am thrilled to announce the launch of several community events designed to bring us together and enhance our quality of life.

I am pleased to share several accomplishments as I look over the past quarter in fulfilling our commitment to the community.

- Riegler Asphalt and Hometown Concrete Cement and Blacktop will be opening this fall additional development of the former Neyer Property this property expected bringing more jobs to Wilder.
- Fischer condos are in high demand. The new road will be constructed that will tie Bentwood Hills Drive to Three Mile/Gibson Lane.
- Atlantic Heavy Duty is opening this summer in the former Key Solutions Building bringing 15-18 new jobs to Wilder.
- Bobby Mackey's is progressing through the new building phases.
- The church property on 3 Mile had an option to purchase. We anticipate a new development on the property should the contract close.
- Office expansion expected at Jones Springs as their business grows.
- The new sewer line is installed serving Frederick's Landing current & future projects.
- Duke is installing a new, main gas line with more capacity to service the area.
- Our hiring efforts have been outstanding. 4 police recruits; 2 recently graduated; one paramedic; additional FF/EMTs two enrolling in paramedic school, an additional public works laborer to name several.
- Extension to the trail at Frederick's Landing is being engineered. Plans to commence by summer.
- In a few months, we hope to have "Coffee Shop Coming Soon" advertised. I conducted a
 business impact survey with our business leaders. The outcome was highly favorable &
 supportive.
- Recent audit produced stellar results with the auditor commenting "The balance sheet is strong, you had a good year. Just keep doing what you're doing".
- Full Calendar of Events available offering fun activities for all.
- 8 roads repaired this past year; Spring inspection completed with additional repairs scheduled.
- Speed limit reduced to 35 MPH on Three Mile.
- Ladder truck (Quint) delivery expected by June. Fire Chief & team to make the final inspection early May, 2025.
- Weekly Active Aging classes to resume May 7; Music Festival is May 17.
- The Veterans' Banners were a success and will be raised by Memorial Day. If you would like to purchase one and honor a Veteran, complete the banner application included in this newsletter.
