

**CITY OF WILDER, KENTUCKY
ORDINANCE NO. 26-0201**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 93 MUNICIPAL PARKS OF
THE WILDER MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING ADDING CITY
CENTER PARK, AMENDING PARK REGULATIONS AND FEES.**

WHEREAS, the City of Wilder has previously adopted Chapter 93 of the Wilder Municipal Code relating to municipal parks in the City of Wilder; and,

WHEREAS, parks have been added to the municipal park system and fees for shelter rentals have been reviewed and need to be updated in city policy; and,

WHEREAS, it has been suggested that Section 93 municipal parks regulations also needs to be reviewed and updated accordingly.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
WILDER, CAMPBELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:**

§ 93.01 REGULATIONS ON USE.

(A) The following rules and regulations are established for the use of all municipal parks in the city.

~~(1) Rule 1: Membership. Membership cards will be sold to city residents and nonresidents, \$10 per year. (\$10 fee for residents shall be covered by ad valorem taxes).~~

~~(2) Rule 2: Registration. All persons must register, during weekdays, with the City Clerk/Treasurer, who will issue a card, listing the person's name and time and date when permitted to use the basketball, tennis, and horseshoe courts. (City Clerk/Treasurer's office open 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday).~~

~~(3) Rule 3: Time limit. A one hour time limit is set for each pass holder (if someone is waiting with a card).~~

~~(4) Rule 4: Public meetings. No person or persons, except with the written permission of the Wilder Recreation Commission, shall hold or attend any public meetings, discussion, debate, picnic, or gathering of any kind on or within park property; except that family parties or small groups of picnickers will not be required to obtain such written permission.~~

~~(5) Rule 5: Concerts. 7) No person or persons, except with the written consent of the Commission, City shall play on or operate any musical instrument or hold any musical concert on or within park property.~~

~~(6) Rule 6: Flags. 8) No person or persons, except with the written consent of the Commission, City shall display any banner, flag, target, sign or device for advertising or other purpose on or within park property.~~

~~(7) Rule 7: Parades. No person or persons, except with the written consent of the Commission, shall engage in any parade, drill or procession of any kind on or within park property.~~

~~(8) Rule 8: Races. No person or persons shall engage in, or in any way be party to, any races of any kind, whether between animals, bicycles, motorcycles, automobiles, or vehicles of any kind or otherwise on or within park property. Bicycles are to be parked in bicycle rack.~~

~~(9) Rule 9:1) Damage and refuse.~~

~~(a) No person or persons shall take, carry away, disturb, molest, destroy, mar, deface, mutilate, mark, or damage anything on or within park property.~~

~~(b) No person shall drop or throw paper, lunch boxes, refuse, or litter on or within any park property, but shall place the same in receptacles provided for such purposes. No glass containers are permitted on tennis pickleball and basketball courts.~~

~~10) Rule 10: Baseball and golf. No person shall throw or bat a hard ball, or drive, putt, or play with a golf ball, except at such places as are set aside therefor by the Commission.~~

~~(11) Rule 11: Sales. No person shall sell or expose anything for sale within the park properties or on any sidewalk bounding such properties except with written permission of the Commission.~~

~~(12) Rule 12:2) Animals.~~

~~(a) No animals shall be permitted within improved picnic or play areas or splash pad.~~

~~(b) No horses shall be permitted in parks unless trails for that purpose have been provided.~~

(c) No person shall take a dog on or within any park property unless the dog is held by leash, chain, or cord, nor shall any person permit any animal of any kind to run at large on or within park properties, nor shall any animal be tied to any tree, plant, or shrub.

(13) ~~[Reserved]~~

(14) ~~Rule 14: 3~~ Fires. No person, other than employees, shall light, make, or use any fire within park properties, or close to any park fence, gate, or other structure, except in fireplaces provided therefor, unless written permission is obtained from the ~~Commission~~ City and the fire chief.

(15) ~~Rule 15: 4~~ Liquor. No person shall take into or make use of any alcoholic beverages on ~~tennis pickleball~~ or basketball courts.

(16) ~~Rule 16: 5~~ Speed. No person shall drive any vehicle over park property except the roadways provided for this purpose and on such roadways only at a reasonable speed in view of all the circumstances and in a careful manner; speed in excess of 15 miles per hour on roads within parks shall be prima facie evidence of reckless driving.

(17) ~~Rule 17: 6~~ Closing time.

(a) Fredericks Landing Park is open 24 hours a day unless closed for inclement weather, flooding, maintenance, construction or for any reason deemed necessary by the city.

(b) City Center Park shall be open from 7:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. with the operation of the splash pad from 10:00 a.m. until 8:00p.m. daily. The Park shall open at 7:00 a.m. and close at dusk daily and no one shall be in the park after that hour except upon special permit of the Commission. A suitable sign shall be erected at the entrance so as to inform the public.

~~(B) Any person violating any of the rules listed above concerning the use of municipal parks in the city shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, shall be fined not less than \$1 nor more than \$100 for each offense.~~

93.02 CITY CENTER PARK AND SPLASH PAD

1. No Glass Containers
2. No Food or Drinks allowed in Splash Pad area
3. No Pets allowed on Splash Pad
4. Children should have proper supervision
5. No Smoking in City Center Park or Splash Pad.
6. No water shall be poured on slides in dry area of park
7. No alcohol at City Center Park

93.02 CITY CENTER PARK PICKLEBALL AND SPORT COURT

1. 60 Minute time limit per court

2. No alcohol permitted
3. No glass containers
4. No vehicles of any kind permitted on pickleball court

FREDERICK'S LANDING

§ 93.10 PARK STICKER REQUIRED; FEES.

No individual shall be permitted to come upon the premises of Frederick's Landing or use any of its facilities without having purchased a park sticker. The costs of the park stickers are as follows:

(A)\$2 per day per vehicle.

(B)\$10 per day per vehicle with attached trailer.

(C)\$10 per year per vehicle.

(D)\$50 per year per vehicle with attached trailer.

(E)A separate annual residential sticker will be issued to city residents. Residents must present valid proof of residency in the form of a driver's license/vehicle registration to the City Clerk's office. Upon proof of establishing residency, an annual resident sticker will be issued free of charge. One sticker per residential address additional stickers may be purchased at the normal rate. This sticker is non transferable and must be permanently affixed on the front windshield of the vehicle to which the pass has been issued. Vehicles not matching the registration of the vehicle to which the annual resident pass has been issued will be cited as being in violation of park rules for not having a park sticker.

§ 93.11 REGULATIONS.

All individuals who choose to come upon the premises of the Frederick's Landing or use any of its facilities shall be bound by the following additional rules and regulations.

(A)The speed limit in the park and on the access road leading to the park is 15 m.p.h. Any form of reckless and improper driving is prohibited.

(B)No parking is permitted on the boat ramp or on the grass.

(C)No motor vehicle or trailer shall be parked in excess of 24 hours continuously unless approved by the police department.

(D)No alcoholic beverages are permitted in the park except for shelter rentals.

(E)Anyone in the park ~~during closing hours will~~ when the park is closed may be guilty of cited for trespassing.

(F)All vehicles shall have the parking sticker required in § 93.10 displayed on the lower righthand side of the front windshield.

(G)Any motor vehicle, the owner or operator of which has been cited for a violation under this subchapter and has not paid the citation, will be towed ~~to the police impounding lot~~ at the owner's expense upon the issuance of a second citation.

(H)No camping or setting up camp is permitted within the park.

(I)No swimming is permitted in or around the park.

(J)There shall be no littering or discharging of any form of trash or rubbish anywhere in the park.

(K)No parking is permitted in designated areas for persons with disabilities unless the vehicle is properly authorized to do so and has clearly displayed the license plates or window tag.

(L)No repairs of any vehicle shall be permitted in the park.

§ 93.12 SHELTER RENTAL FREDERICKS LANDING

The daily rental for the main shelter at Frederick's Landing is set at ~~one hundred twenty five dollars (\$125.00)~~ sixty-five (\$65.00) per day for residents and businesses in the city and ~~seventy-five (\$75.00)~~ per day for all other rentals. An application for rental of the shelter must be completed and all fees paid in order to reserve a shelter at Frederick's Landing Park. In addition, a security deposit of one hundred twenty five dollars (\$125.00) shall also be made upon reservation of the shelter. Said security deposit will be returned less daily vehicle passes purchased by guests using the facility and after an inspection is made by the Wilder Public Works Department and the keys are returned to the City Clerk's Office.

SHELTER RENTAL CITY CENTER PARK

The shelters at City Center Park are reserved in four (4) hour increments. Times are from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. and 4p.m.-8p.m. The fee for a four-hour rental is \$25.00 for Monday thru Thursday and \$50.00 for Friday, Saturday and Sunday rentals. A reduced fee will be charged to Wilder residents and businesses of \$40.00. An application for rental of the shelter must be completed and all fees paid in order to reserve a shelter at City Center Park.

§ 93.99 PENALTY.

(A) Any person violating any of the provisions § 93.10 receiving a citation will be permitted to void the citation upon payment of the amount of the yearly park sticker fee payable to the city. If a citation is issued and remains unpaid after fourteen (14) days, a fine is levied doubling the original amount of the citation issued.

(B) Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a class B misdemeanor punishable by up to 90 days in jail and a two hundred fifty dollar (\$250.00) fine. However, the officer shall have the option of issuing a city citation with a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) payable to the city.


